

GDPR Policy on Data and Privacy

Introduction

As a members club we appreciate that privacy is important both to prospective members wishing to join the club as well as existing and former members alike. No one likes having their data lost, stolen, damaged, misused or shared without proper consent, so we are doing everything we can to protect you in this matter. This section explains how we collect, store and handle your personal data.

Why we collect your data

The data we hold about you helps us to start the enrolment procedure to join the club, to enable us to maintain member records so that we can for instance, advise when renewal is due and to enable us to update you on club events and competitions and functions/social events.

What data is collected

- Address
- Age: (for purposes of administering age related membership categories)
- Contact details (address, telephone and email)
- Disabilities (for insurance and access purposes)
- Section 21 declaration.
- No other information is taken

How we collect your data

We do this in a number of ways such as when you make an enquiry via our Facebook page, by email or in person.

Who we share your data with

You data will not be shared with any other member other than appropriate and active committee members, our insurers (if requested) and NSRA/BFTA/CSFTA as required for purposes of administering the club and competition events. We do not share your data with any other third parties.

Data Retention

If you are applying for membership, your data is held for 12 months after application in case of any delays by us or by you and enables us to contact you to re-organise a probation/induction. As a member your data is held on electronic file/ and this paper copy for the duration of your membership. If you leave the club, your details are held for a one year period before being deleted. This is in case you wish to re-join within this time period during which you will be exempt from attending another induction/ probation period.

Know your rights

You have many rights regarding your personal data, including seeing what data we hold and updating your information. To apply for access, please contact the or Club Secretary. This will be facilitated within fourteen days of application or as soon as reasonably practicable (Please bear in mind that these positions are voluntary and as such, there is no one to easily step in if the authorised member is on holiday or dealing with non-club commitments).

Frobury FT Safety Rules

1. Only legal Air rifles to be used on the premises sub 12ft lbs, no firearms.
2. All members of FFTC and visitors shall at all times, comply with the requirements of the law in relation to the use, ownership and operation of air rifles.
3. At no time must members or visitors carry a loaded rifle, this includes removing magazines.
4. Members and visitors must not shoot at any living thing, target supports, trees, vegetation or anything other than targets.
5. Members and visitors will ensure that at no time are air rifles shouldered, pointed or discharged at any place other than over the firing lines.
6. Air rifles must be pointed muzzle down at all times.
7. On hearing either a single whistle, horn or a verbal instruction, air rifles must be discharged into the ground at a safe distance across the firing line immediately and members must indicate that the air rifle is safe.
8. Members may resume shooting in a safe manner after all persons are off the range and a double whistle/horn sounded or a verbal command given by the person who originally called the ceasefire.
9. No dogs allowed in the wooded areas.
10. The areas to be kept clean and tidy you are responsible for your own rubbish.
11. No fires to be lit on the ground.
12. All members are expected to be conversant with these Rules. Ignorance is no excuse.
